Step 6: Please enter the OTP received and click Submit. Step 7: Please click Vote for the selected candidate to cast your Vote.


Step 8: Click Yes to Confirm your Vote.



- 7. Member to click & select the candidate of their choice.
- 8. Member will see a confirmation message, "Are you sure you want to Vote?"
- 9. Press "Yes" to cast your vote and you will get a Success message.
- 10. The Link cannot be reused for voting once the voting process completed.





Burden of Smoking

Smoking is the single most preventable cause of death in the world. Smoking kills upto 1 in 2 users. Smoking is a risk factor for 6 of the 8 leading causes of death including Heart diseases, Cerebrovascular disease, Cancer and Pulmonary disease. More than 4000 chemicals have been identified in tobacco smoke. Approximately 250

are toxic or carcinogenic chemicals. Quiting smoking is an important prevention of disease progression by behavioural supports like counselling and with pharmacotherapy using nicotine replacement therapy (NRT) and non-nicotinic pharmacotherapy with Bupropion and Varenicline.



World Arthritis day and **World Osteoporosis Day**

What we need to know?

One third of our population gets their

musculoskeletal health affected at least once in their life time. The incidence and prevalence of arthritis is increasing while the newer medications are also coming to be used frequently.

What we know about arthritis? While a rheumatologist manage the inflammatory arthritis and tries to control the immune system with immunomodulators, orthopedicians manage the osteoarthritis and bone diseases including the malignancy of the bones. Osteoarthritis still the common form affecting many people when old however treatable arthritis include rheumatoid arthritis, psoriatic arthritis and spondyloarthritis.

Recent understanding of the pathogenesis of inflammatory arthritis has paved the way for achieving remission and near cure using DMARDS and biologic drugs. Infact many biologics were used in India for Covid 19 pneumonia and SIRS- systemic inflammatory syndrome. As you are aware Rheumatology deals with multiorgan disease and multidisciplinary approach remains the key in the management of patients with arthritis and it's important to educate the patient's family too in this process.

Magnitude of the problem: According to the 2011 census, the reported prevalence of RA in India has varied from 0.3% to 0.75%. Assuming an average prevalence of 0.5% with the adult population of 60%, the projected burden of RA in India is 36 million patients. Osteoarthritis is the second most common with a prevalence of 22% to 39%. Nearly 45% of women over the age of 65 yrs will have symptoms and other forms of arthritis are increasing

Management of arthritis: DMARDS are the standard drugs for use in patients with arthritis however recent discoveries have improved the efficacy of drug therapy like cytokine inhibitors called biologics. Although expensive these drugs have been proven to achieve remission of arthritis and synthetic DMARDS would maintain remission. Inflammatory arthritis is a cardiovascular risk factor adding to the metabolic syndrome too.

Cost-effective management of rheumatoid arthritis (RA) is an important issue, the world over. In resource poor countries there are the added issues of affordability, availability, and accessibility. These limit free and easy access to newer therapeutic agents, physiotherapy, joint replacement, and sometimes even standard disease modifying anti-rheumatic drugs (DMARD) based therapy.. Perceptions of the disease, compliance, misconceptions of therapy, peer pressure are important considerations for successful implementation of therapy. Patient satisfaction is important. Many patients are comfortable at low disease activity. The impact and lure of alternative therapies is another important issue. Improved socioeconomic status will improve affordability and treatment. Poverty and lack of education are recognized markers of poor outcome.

Prevention: For arthritis:

- ▶ Modifiable risk factors like smoking obesity to be addressed,
- ▶ DMARDS to be used appropriately and monitored and aim to achieve remission.

When we approach a patient with arthritis, dental hygiene, weight maintenance and physical activity are important. Although genetics and immune disease can't be cured, current approach to achieve remission and treat to target approach can help to reach "near cure".

Magnitude of problem of osteoporosis:

Osteoporosis affects people of all ages and races but puts Caucasian and Asian women past menopause at the highest risk. According to World Health Organisation, Osteoporosis comes second to cardiovascular disease as a global health problem. As per statistics, one out of eight men and one out of three women in India are affected by Osteoporosis.

The WHO definition applies to postmenopausal women and men aged 50 years or older. The T-score is the patient's bone density compared with the BMD of control subjects who are at their peak BMD. The Z-score reflects a bone density compared with that of patients matched for age and sex. prevalence of low bone mass is more than 40% from the age of 40 years and increases to more than 62% by age 60 and 80% by the age of 65 years in India.

Osteoporosis is a serious public health concern with increasing age. In India, estimates suggest that of the 230 million Indians expected to be over the age of 50 years in 2020, 20%, i.e., 46 million are women who may suffer with osteoporosis. Habitual low intakes of calcium have been reported in toddlers, adolescents, pregnant mothers, and postmenopausal women. Longitudinal studies of changes in bone mass during growth have confirmed that in girls, the greatest increases in bone mass occur between the ages of 12–15 years, compared with 14–17 years in boys. Hence, children should be targeted first to raise awareness and also increase Vitamin D intake.

The awareness of osteoporosis is low in India with surveys indicating that only 10%-15% is aware of the disease. Urbanization appears to be associated with an increase in the prevalence of osteoporosis due to lifestyle changes, lower physical activity, increase in indoor living, and lower sun exposure. The 1-year mortality after hip fractures is high at 30% in the public hospitals. For both genders, exercise was equally positively associated with Bone Mineral Density (BMD).

The most common sites of fragility fracture are the hip, spine, and forearm. The other sites are pelvis, proximal femur, proximal humerus and tibia.

Risk Factors for osteoporosis

Nonmodifiable: ► Advanced age (>50 years) ► Female sex ► White or Asian ethnicity ► Genetic factors as family history of osteoporosis ► Dementia

Potentially modifiable: ▶ Cigarette smoking ▶ Low body weight (<58 kg or 127 lb) ▶ Recurrent falls ▶ Inadequate physical activity ▶ Estrogen deficiency ▶ Drugs* ▶ Alcohol use ▶ Early menopause ▶ Prolonged premenopausal amenorrhea ▶ Androgen or estrogen deficiency ▶ Calcium deficiency ▶ Poor health.

How to diagnose Osteoporosis and prevent fragility fractures:

Patients with risk factors and history of previous low trauma fractures need assessment and measurement of bone mineral density by DEXA scan. It is widely accessible in the radiology centres. WHO recommends FRAX risk calculation using an online tool devised by the University of Sheffield, UK but tailored to India. Adequate physical exercise, healthy diet and good habits will go a long way to prevent osteoporotic fractures to a large extent.

Apart from postmenopausal osteoporosis, secondary causes like Hypogonadism, thyrotoxicosis, Cushing syndrome, anorexia nervosa, malabsorption syndromes, chronic liver and renal disease, drugs like glucocorticoids and anticonvulsants should also be explored in evaluation. Chronic inflammatory conditions like rheumatoid arthritis may lead to secondary osteoporosis.

Management of osteoporosis:

- 1. Identify the primary cause and address the risk factors.
- 2. If glucocorticoid use is the reason, then primary prevention is the key.
- 3. Bisphosphonates should be used in all patients initiating GC (Prednisolone > 7.5 mg/day) for more than 3 months if they fulfill any of the following
- Post-menopausal women.
- ▶ Men > 65 years.
- ▶ Baseline BMD T-score <-1.5.
- Previous fragility fracture.
- 4. All acute vertebral, long bone fractures and osteoporosis related fractures should be evaluated and treatment initiated.

Drug treatment:

For osteoporosis: Bisphosphonates are usually the first line of drugs used. We use alendronate weekly, risedronate weekly, ibandronate monthly, and zoledronic acid yearly along with calcium and vitamin D supplementation. Other drugs include- Teriparatide (PTHr), Denosumab and Abolaparatide. On occasions verterboplasty is also recommended in expert centres with very good pain relief.

How can we prevent?

Regular exercise like jogging, brisk walking and stair climbing will be beneficial. Smoking cessation ,sufficient calcium, vitamin D and protein are essential for bone and muscle health.

Conclusion: In conclusion, to prevent arthritis and lead a healthy life, it is important we maintain the musculoskeletal health. Bone health can be optimized by achieving peak bone mass during adolescence, maintenance of healthy bone throughout the life cycle, and prevention of bone loss. Follow up is essential to maintain adequate bone health.

So for more than 1500 Lawyer Notices were replied by me on behalf of our PPLSSS Members. I have gone through all the case sheets pertaining to the legal Notices. 99% of case sheets are not properly maintained. Nearly 95% of doctors never get a proper consent from the patients before surgery and treatment. In this article I am going to discuss with you, about consent and its importance.

- 1) What is Consent? When two or more persons agree upon the same sense they are to consent as per the definition of consent given in section 13 of Indian Contract Act 1872.
- 2) What are all the types of consents? I) Implied consent

Consent can be implied in some circumstances from the action of the patient. For example, when patient enters a Dentist's clinic and sits in the dental chair, his consent is implied for examination, diagnosis and consultation.

- II) Express Consent There is, however, a significant difference in the nature of express consent of the patient, known as 'real consent 'in UK and as 'informed consent' in America.
- a. Real Consent (UK) or Valid Consent Pt voluntarily giving the Consent.
- b. Informed Consent (America) Followed by India. - "Consent that is given by a person after receipt of the following information: the Nature and purpose of the proposed procedure or treatment; the expected outcome and the likelihood of success; the risks; the alternatives to the procedure and supporting information regarding those alternatives; and the effect of no treatment or procedure, including the effect on the prognosis and the material risks associated with no treatment. Also included are instructions concerning what should be done if the procedure turns out to be harmful or unsuccessful."
- c. We should get informed Consent for 1) All major diagnostic procedures 2) General anaesthesia 3) Surgical operations 4) Intimate examinations 5) Examination for determining age, potency and virginity and 6) In medico -legal cases. (16.1.2008

3) From whom we have to get a consent?

A sane and conscious Person above 18 years of age can give valid consent to suffer any harm, which may result from an act not intended or not known to cause death or grievous hurt (Sec.87, I.P.C.). If less than 18 years Father, Mother, legal heir & Guardian can give consent.

Dear doctors, To emphasis the importance of consent I am going to present a case received by the head of the obstetrics department and her associates at one of the medical colleges of the east zone.

A lady of 23 years attended the near by PHC for her first pregnancy. She developed labor pain in time, and went to PHC for delivery. Since delivery was difficult she was referred to medical college hospital. On receiving at Medical college hospital, Duty doctor examined her and suspected rupture uterus. At once she consulted with the unit chief and head of the department and according to their advice she did laparotomy. At laparotomy she found baby was lying in the abdominal cavity and there was irregular rupture of uterus and the tear extended into broad ligaments, infundibulopelvic ligaments, fallopian tubes and both side ovaries were severely injured.

At once duty doctor informed to the associate professors of OG department. They also came to the Operation Theatre. Hysterectomy along with Bilateral salpingo oophorectomy was done. They tried to save uterus and both ovaries. Because of severe tear and damage they couldnot save them. After the surgery patient recoverd well and was discharged in a good condition.

Few months after discharge, now patient issued a legal notice against the duty doctor and to associate professors. In that notice she said,

- 1. Laparotomy and Hysterectomy done with the consent of her husband but consent not abtained for the removal of ovaries.
- 2. Patient says in her notice that her age is 23. As per medical ethics and rules and regulation before doing surgery, consent must be got from her only.
- 3. In her case consent was not obtained from her for laparatomy, Hysterectomy and for the removal of ovaries.
- 4. So the above surgeries were done by above three doctors, they have to pay compensation of

rupees 20 Lakhs for not obtaining consent from her for the above said surgeries.

From the above notice, on behalf of Doctors, Reply was prepared and given by PPLSSS. I have quoted the following judgement in the reply.

18. We may also refer to the code of medical ethics laid down by the Medical Council of India (approved by the Central Government under section 33 of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956). It contains a chapter relating to disciplinary action which enumerates a list of responsibilities, violation of which will be professional misconduct. Clause 13 of the said chapter places the following responsibility on a doctor:

"13. Before performing an operation the physician should obtain in writing the consent from the husband or wife, parent or guardian in the case of a minor, or the patient himself as the case may be. In an operation which may result in sterility the consent of both husband and wife is needed."

Will the above judegement alone solve the problems of the OG Doctors?


