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STATE PRESIDENT MESSAGE

Dr. B. SRIDHAR

IMA State President

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Dear Friends and Respected Seniors,

It gives me great pleasure to write to you once again as your State President.

Before I post my main message let me thank IMA Tirunelveli and team led by Dr. Abu Backer, backed by Dr. Prabhuraj and Kannan not to leave Dr. Mohd Ibrahim for their timely help to the state office and conduct a wonderful SCM in short notice.

There are recent press reports regarding the Supreme Court and the continued applicability of the Consumer Protection Act (CPA) to medical services. Personally, I have felt all along that securing an exemption for the medical profession from the CPA would not be an easy exercise. The judiciary has a legitimate role in protecting patients' rights, while governments have to balance this with the genuine concerns of the medical profession. Consumer and human-rights organisations are also likely to strongly oppose any move perceived as diluting patient protection.

At the same time, we must honestly recognise the

increasingly difficult environment in which doctors are practising today.

Healthcare has undergone enormous change. Government hospitals, particularly in Tamil Nadu, provide good-quality treatment at nominal cost. Government initiatives such as CEmONC and welfare measures for antenatal mothers have considerably strengthened public-sector maternity care. Insurance schemes have also made major procedures, including cardiac surgery, accessible to many patients.

Yet there remains a particularly vulnerable section of society—the middle class. Many have limited or no adequate insurance coverage and may still prefer private healthcare. When faced with a major illness, they may be compelled to exhaust their savings or even take substantial loans to meet medical expenses.

As long as the outcome is favourable, most families somehow accept this burden. But when an unexpected complication, adverse outcome or medical accident occurs, financial distress and grief can quickly turn into anger and confrontation.

Today, this problem is further magnified by social media.

With WhatsApp, Instagram, Facebook, X and other platforms, an incident outside a hospital can become a major public issue within hours. Allegations of “wrong treatment” may spread widely even before the facts are established. The good work and reputation built by a doctor or institution over many years can suddenly be overshadowed by a single incident and intense social-media attention.

Political representatives, community leaders and self-proclaimed social activists may enter the situation. Videos and reels can amplify allegations and emotions. The police, understandably concerned about maintaining law and order, may sometimes encourage the parties to arrive at a settlement. On occasions, negotiations may even take place in police stations.

Meanwhile, the affected doctor, the doctor's family and the hospital staff are placed under tremendous mental and professional pressure.

Many doctors are understandably hesitant to immediately approach the courts. Their first instinct is often to seek the support of IMA.

This is where IMA has an important responsibility.

When an affected member seeks assistance, the local IMA office-bearers, with the support of the State Office whenever required, should stand beside the doctor. Our responsibility is to ensure that the facts are properly presented, that due process is followed and that no doctor is subjected to intimidation or extra-legal pressure.

But there is one principle on which we must remain absolutely clear:

IMA will support its members, but IMA will not support forced settlements.

There should be no forced settlement—no ‘கட்டப் பஞ்சாயத்து.’

If any monetary settlement is contemplated, it must be voluntary, lawful, properly documented and undertaken through an appropriate process. It should never be the result of threats, intimidation, social-media pressure, political intervention or mob pressure.

Unfortunately, there have been instances where doctors have sought IMA's intervention but subsequently entered into private negotiations without keeping the IMA representatives informed. On occasions, office-bearers who were actively handling the issue have come to know about a settlement only through the media or third parties.

This places the organisation and its office-bearers in an extremely difficult position.

When IMA enters a crisis situation, it can work effectively only when the affected



member cooperates fully and transparently with the office-bearers who are trying to help.

We must also consider the larger consequences. Every doctor does not have the financial capacity to meet the compensation amounts that may be demanded today. What will a young consultant who has just started practice do? What will a small or medium-sized hospital do when confronted with an enormous demand?

Repeatedly agreeing to large payouts under pressure can have consequences far beyond an individual case. It may later be portrayed as an admission of wrongdoing and could invite further demands. It may create an expectation that similar pressure can be exerted on other doctors and hospitals. Most importantly, it can weaken the collective strength of IMA and make it increasingly difficult for the organisation to protect its members in future crises.

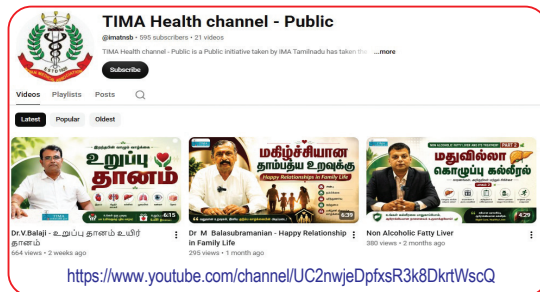
The State IMA is therefore seriously concerned about the growing tendency to resolve medico-legal disputes simply through payments made under pressure.

We Need a Structured System.

IMA Tamil Nadu State Branch proposes to approach the Government for the development of standard guidelines and a structured response protocol for situations involving allegations of medical negligence, hospital violence, public agitation and social-media campaigns against doctors and healthcare institutions.

We will seek appropriate governmental support to ensure that genuine patient grievances are addressed fairly and promptly through due process, while doctors and healthcare institutions are equally protected from intimidation, blackmail, violence and extra-legal pressure.

However, government support alone will not solve the problem.



There must also be discipline, transparency and mutual trust within our own organisation.

When a member seeks IMA's intervention, the member should give a clear commitment to cooperate fully with the local and State office-bearers and keep the organisation informed of every important development until the matter is resolved.

Similarly, when local IMA office-bearers intervene in a crisis, they should obtain a clear understanding from the affected doctor that he or she will cooperate with the organisation and will not independently negotiate or conclude a settlement without keeping the IMA representatives informed.

This is not about taking away an individual doctor's freedom to make decisions. It is about ensuring that a collective intervention undertaken in good faith is not undermined by parallel negotiations.

IMA must remain an organisation that every doctor can confidently turn to in a moment of distress.

But an organisation is only as strong as the unity and discipline of its members.

If members seek IMA's support but do not cooperate with the organisation once it intervenes, we risk gradually becoming a weak and toothless organisation—an association

known only for CME programmes, meetings and get-togethers, but unable to stand firmly beside a member when a real crisis arises.

That cannot be our future.

IMA must be more than an organisation that brings doctors together.

IMA must be an organisation that stands together when a doctor is under pressure.

Let us strengthen our unity, respect due process, protect patients' rights, defend doctors against injustice and ensure that every intervention by IMA is meaningful, principled and effective.

When IMA steps in, we must stand together.

If you want your organisation to help you, you should promise your office-bearers that you will abide by their directions and cooperate with them until the very end of the problem. On their part, local Branch office-bearers should obtain a clear commitment from the affected doctor that, once IMA is involved, he or she will allow the organisation to handle the situation and will fully cooperate with the office-bearers until the matter is brought to its conclusion.

Long Live IMA.

18 August 2026 – A Strong Beginning with Public Health

IMA TNSB ORATIONS – RENEWAL & WAY FORWARD – 2026

- As per the IMA TNSB Constitution, Orations are to be renewed once every 10 years, with a renewal contribution of ₹ 3 lakhs.
- As per the bye-law, an Oration can be converted into a Medal.
- During the Past Presidents' and Secretaries' Meeting held at Tirunelveli on Saturday, 5 September 2026, it was finalised that an Oration not renewed would be converted into a Medal on payment of ₹ 50,000. If the contribution is not made, the Oration will be discontinued.
- The above decision was approved at the 330th State Council Meeting (SCM) held on Sunday, 6 September 2026, at Madha Maligai, KTC Nagar, Tirunelveli.
- In IMA TNSB, the AGM is held in September every year, during which the audited accounts and other statutory matters are placed before the General Body for consideration and approval, as required under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act.

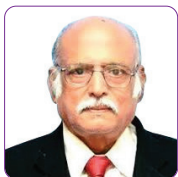

EYE DONATION

In our country, we have an estimated 4.6 million people with corneal blindness (90% are below the age of 45 years of which 60% are below the age of 12 years). In addition to this, 20,000 new cases are added to this figure every year.

The Eye Bank Association of India (EBAI) is a voluntary organization helping persons with corneal blindness by facilitating eye donations. At present we have more than 175 eye banks in India. Only half of them are fully functioning.

Eye Donation is done only after death. Whole eye is not transplanted. Cornea is transplanted. Sclera can also be transplanted. The whole eye can be used for valuable research and development.

Corneal blindness can result from

Corneal infections, Trauma, Corneal dystrophies, Degenerative disorders, Chemical injuries, congenital conditions, Complications Of Previous Ocular Disease or Surgery

A Corneal transplant is an operation that replaces a disc-shaped segment of an impaired or opaque cornea with a similar shaped clear cornea obtained from a human donor. More than 90 per cent of corneal transplant operations successfully restore the recipient's vision.

Eyes can be donated even if the donor has not pledged before. Eye donors can belong to any age group or sex. People who use spectacles, short sightedness, long sightedness or astigmatism or even those operated for cataract can still donate, as these conditions may not affect the cornea. Patients who are diabetics, those

suffering from hypertension, asthma can also donate eyes.

Patients suffering from rabies, Tetanus, Aids, Jaundice- hepatitis B, hepatitis C, septicemia, Cancer, Gangrene, Brain Tumor, Food Poisoning and a person who has died due to drowning, Acute leukemia (Blood cancer), Cholera, and Infectious diseases like Meningitis, Encephalitis and death due to an unknown cause cannot donate eyes.

It is illegal to buy and sell human eyes; organs and tissues families are not given any remuneration. Certificates are given. Costs associated with eye procurement are absorbed by the eye bank. The recipient is not told about the donor.

As per NOTTOS manual cornea remains viable for 6-8 hours after death.

Once the death of a willing donor occurs, the relatives must inform the nearby Eye Bank or any ophthalmologist as the retrieval must take place within 6-8 hours from the demise time.

Immediate Measures after Death

While awaiting the eye bank retrieval team, **NOTTO** guidance includes measures such as:

- Closing the deceased person's eyes
- Placing wet cotton or gauze over the closed eyelids to reduce drying
- Turning of the fan to minimize drying
- Elevating the head approximately 45 degrees where appropriate.

The team comprises of a doctor/experienced trained sisters. The family receives them. First to get the willingness from them and ask them about the disease. Then the eyes are retrieved

takings 20-30 minutes for both eyes.

First conjunctiva is separated from the limbal margin all over 360 degrees. 6 ocular muscles are cut. Then optic nerve is cut and the eye ball is placed with the small sterile container. For the next eye same procedure. Cotton ball is kept in the socket and the lids are Sutured with one suture. There is no disfigurement.

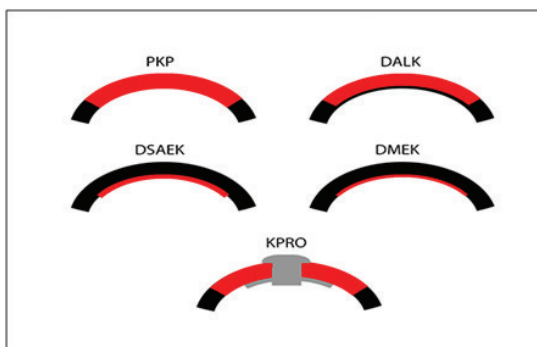
The eyes are taken to the retrieval Centre / Eye bank. The cornea is cut with scleral fill and placed in Cornesol 5 liquid for 9 hours. Then the cornea is seen in the specular microscopy where the cell density is more than 2000 cells/mm² is noted.

Surgeon is informed. This tissue can be used within 7 days for optical purpose. within 15 days for therapeutic purpose. The surgeon before surgery sees the corneal button in the slit lamp and decides about the type of surgery.

Sclera can be preserved in Glycerine for one year and used for Scleral graft.

While full-thickness corneal transplant techniques have not changed much over the past century, lamellar corneal transplant techniques have evolved rapidly. They are as follows:

Figure 1: Schematic portraying the region of corneal tissue transplanted (red) for various modern keratoplasty techniques, including penetrating keratoplasty (PK), deep anterior lamellar keratoplasty (DALK), Descemet stripping automated endothelial keratoplasty (DSAEK), Descemet membrane endothelial keratoplasty (DMEK), and Boston Type I Keratoprosthesis (KPRO).



DALK : Deep Anterior Lamellar Keratoplasty

This technique consists of grafting only a part of the stroma and the Descemet membrane. It is used in cases where the endothelium is healthy. - Keratoconus

DLEK: Deep Lamellar Endothelial Keratoplasty

This technique is used when the endothelial layer is diseased. Only the endothelium and a portion of the stroma will be grafted.

DSEK ET DSAEK: Descemet Stripping (Automated) Endothelial Keratoplasty

The two techniques are similar; they only differ in the manner in which the cornea tissue is prepared for transplantation; manually in DSEK or automatically in DSAEK (thanks to a Microkeratome or a Femtolaser). It is used in cases where the surgeon needs to graft the deeper layers of the cornea with an almost non-existent stroma.

DMEK : Descemet Membrane Endothelial Keratoplasty

This technique is the most complex and precise, as it involves the grafting of only Descemet's membrane and the endothelium.

So, one eye can be used for 3 recipients.

1. DALK – Epithelium and Stroma
2. DSEK,DMEK - DM and Endothelium
3. Sclera - For scleral grafts

I have given only the basic points.

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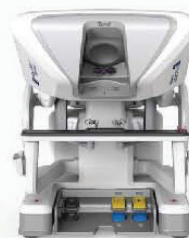
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
